MOTORISTS

Bicycles belong on the road by law. Avoiding collisions with cyclists is easy with a few good habits

Cyclists are slow-moving vehicles, and are expected to follow the same rules of the road as motor vehicles

When parked on the road, check mirrors before swinging car doors open

Check mirrors and blind spots often. Shoulder check before turning right

Did you know?

Cyclists can use as much lane as they safely need.

Follow behind until it's safe to change lanes and pass on the left

**Leave
1 metre
(3 feet)
to pass**

Signaling helps cyclists to know where your vehicle is heading

Always signal before turning or changing lanes

Be careful not to cut off cyclists at intersections when making a turn

Cyclists can be moving much faster than you think - up to 40 km/hr
